- 3 Winter Session is defined as First Term (September - December) and Second Term (January - April). Sixty percent of a full course load at UVic (Winter Session: 9 units or 4.5 units per term; Summer Session: 4.5 units) is considered full-time studies for government student loans (for most provinces) and by the Canada Revenue Agency. Waitlisted courses are not included in determination of full-time or part-time attendance.
- 4 Students registered for work terms are considered to be enrolled in a full-time course of studies. Work term units are not used in the determination of year standing and are not part of the academic unit requirement for Bachelor's degrees.
