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Addendum - COVID-19 School Communicable Disease Plan

Dear Blackburn Families,

Please be aware of the updated health and safety measures for Blackburn Elementary School. These measures are in effect from Monday, January 10<sup>th</sup>, 2022 through the end of school session on June 28, 2022. We will update these measures when provided with new information from the Ministry of Education and Ministry of Health in conjunction with the Public Health Officer, Dr. Bonnie Henry. You will find attached to this document an up-to-date copy of the Daily Health Check. For ease of use, please download the Covid-19 Health Check app.

Facilities Staff are expected to follow all SD57 H & S protocols including hand sanitizing, wearing a mask, completing the daily health check and signing in at the office at each school they service  NEW MEASURES: Prior to signing in, Administrative staff will ensure that all visitors read the site-based protocols kept in a duo tang at the office. By signing in they are agreeing to following all site-based protocols, at all times, while in the school
Gatherings and events	School gatherings and events (I.e. assemblies, celebrations, etc.) are held virtually whenever possible  If gatherings and events must be in-person (I.e. inter-school sports games, theatre productions), the number of people in attendance is minimized as much as possible, does not exceed 50% operating capacity, and spectators are not present	•	EXISTING MEASURES: School gatherings, including but not limited to assemblies and celebrations of any kind, will be held via zoom or in individual classrooms. When not possible to be held virtually, events will be postponed until safe to proceed  NEW MEASURES: Intramurals (i.e. lunch time sports events between school-based teams, etc.) will be held with active participants only and no spectators present.

Hand Hygiene	Hand cleaning facilities are available and accessible throughout the school and are well maintained	<ul> <li>EXISTING MEASURES:</li> <li>Staff and students will either use hand sanitizer or wash their hands with soap and water immediately upon entering the school building, every time they come inside from outside NEW MEASURES:</li> <li>Hand sanitizer is available at all entrances</li> <li>Staff and students will use hand sanitizer or wash their hands with soap and water in the following instances: before and after eating, after using the toilet/washroom, before leaving and/or entering a new space in the school, before entering the gym and after leaving the gym (hand sanitizer outside the doors), before going outside to play and when returning inside after breaks, after coughing, sneezing or blowing their nose, and when hands are visibly soiled.</li> </ul>

Symptoms Develop at School	Practices are in place to appropriately respond when a staff member, student, or other person develops symptoms of illness while at school.	<ul> <li>EXISTING MEASURES:</li> <li>School Administrator and/or Teacher in Charge will be notified of student or staff illness immediately upon onset of symptoms</li> <li>School staff or other persons will be asked to leave the school immediately, school secretary will contact Absence Support to update staff absence and request TTOC if needed, students of absent staff will be supervised internally until TTOC arrives or internal coverage is provided</li> <li>Students who become ill at school will be escorted to the COVID Isolation Room/medical room by a staff member. Student will be provided with a clean mask and hand sanitizer. Student will be screened, using the Daily Health Check, by Admin/TIC/Secretary. Admin/TIC will make the decision to call home or send back to class. If decision is to send student home, office staff will request student items be brought to the office and student will remain in the COVID Isolation Room until an adult arrives for pick up. Student and adult will leave by the main entrance to reduce exposure to others.</li> </ul>

		•	Student will be asked to remain home for 24 hours after symptoms improve or disappear and no new symptoms arise. COVID Isolation Room will be cleaned and sanitized by Admin/TIC or other designated staff i.e. school secretaries.  NEW MEASURES:  Vaccinated students who have COVID symptoms will be asked to remain home for a minimum of 5 days and until symptoms disappear. Non-vaccinated students will be asked to remain home for a minimum of 10 days and until symptoms disappear

Masks	Everyone at school (without exemptions), wear masks in accordance with the PHO Order on Face Coverings  Schools work with those with mask exemptions to explore potential strategies to reinforce and enhance other safety measures, as described in the COVID-19 Planning Resource: Mask Exemptions.  Masks are available for those who have forgotten theirs.	•	EXISTING MEASURES:  Admin will update the mask exemption list when contacted directly by parents and provide updated information to school staff and the transportation department (Diversified) Classroom teachers will update parents about any non-compliance issues as they would in normal circumstances  School staff will refer non-compliance to Admin after exhausting existing strategies  NEW MEASURES:  Students with mask exemptions will be placed in seating arrangements where they are not face-to-face with anyone and preferably at the front of the classroom where they are not breathing or talking towards other students. For group work, students with mask exemptions will work side-by-side with others and utilize as much space as possible between group members. When face-to-face conversations are required, students with mask exemptions will be provided with a plexiglass barrier. In music classes where singing is required, students with mask exemptions will be strategically placed to increase distance from other students without causing stigmatism and interfering in learning, and will be provided with a plexiglass barrier. ## Other information:

Parents are asked to provide their child(ren) with reusable/disposable masks for school. We have a limited supply of disposable masks on hand.

Water bottle filling stations are turned on but water fountain bubblers are not. Students need to have their own labeled water bottle for school. Please make sure your child(ren) has one. There are a limited number of disposable cups provided to classrooms. Students without water bottles will be provided with 1 disposable cup/day.

Students may not share any food items brought from home unless shared items are specifically requested by the classroom teacher. This is due to allergies (known and unknown) and preventing the spread of germs. Shared items will be in individual packages or distributed by adults only (fruits/veggies served by the classroom teacher

Classroom windows will be opened when weather allows. Classroom doors will be open to reduce high touch of door knobs.

Classes are permitted to combine for learning purposes/learning activities but must utilize the space available to prevent crowding i.e. Big Buddies and Little Buddies can continue if they utilize both classrooms for space/ two or three classes could come together for physical activities in the gym.

INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL:	WHAT TO DO
Have you returned from travel outside Canada in the last 14 days?	If yes: Fully vaccinated students, staff and other adults who have travelled outside of Canada may qualify for the <u>fully vaccinated traveller exemption</u> . Students, staff and other adults who are not <u>fully vaccinated</u> and have travelled outside of Canada CANNOT attend school for 14 days after arrival, as part of <u>federal requirements</u> .

Call 8-1-1 with any questions about symptoms of illness. If you have severe symptoms, like difficulty breathing (struggling to breathe or you can only speak single words) or chest pain, call 9-1-1 or go to the nearest Emergency Department.
