Please ensure your child does not get dropped off prior to our supervision time. This is especially critical in the winter months when dark and cold conditions are not safe.

Parents are asked to continue keeping their children home from school until they are fully recovered from their illnesses. This prevents the spread of viruses and other communicable diseases. Students should return when they are prepared and are able to actively participate in all classroom activities.



Please phone the school as soon as possible to report if your child is going to be late, away from school that day or in advance of a vacation. The phone number is 250-964-9311. Please help us with the safe arrival of all students.



At Beverly we have five simple rules that we ask students to follow in all settings both inside and outside the building. Please make sure that you know these five expectations:

- S**afe
- T**olerant
- A**ccountable
- R**esponsible/Respectful

All students are able to receive STAR tickets for exhibiting any of the characteristics of a true Beverly STAR.

We also teach students to use their WITS to help solve conflicts. Draws occur weekly recognizing STAR students.



Students are expected to arrive to school wearing clothing appropriate for an educational setting and the current weather conditions so they are able to have breaks outdoors.

Our dress code requires that students:

- ❖ Wear clothing that fully covers their chests, stomachs, and behinds.
- ❖ Remove their hats or hoods while they are in the school.
- ❖ Refrain from spaghetti strap clothing or very short shorts, that may not provide adequate coverage
- ❖ Refrain from wearing clothes that have slogans or images on them that are crude or distasteful. This includes wearing anything that promotes the use of drugs, tobacco, alcohol and/or illegal narcotics or are derogatory in meaning in any way.



Some days, the weather is too miserable to be outside.

There are only a couple of reasons for “in days”:

- 1) temperatures colder than -20 C or
- 2) -20 C because of wind chill
- 3) heavy rain.

Please note that during inside days;

- ➔ students are expected to stay in their classrooms at recess and lunch
- ➔ doors will be open at 8:00 am when supervision begins
- ➔ please send kids with outside clothing in case conditions improve
- ➔ Schools will be open and instruction will continue regardless of the weather condition.
- ➔ School bus service WILL NOT be cancelled because of cold weather.
- ➔ Any bus cancellations will be announced on the radio
- ➔ Students are not expected to wait for a school bus more than 15 minutes beyond the scheduled pickup time. If a bus has not arrived by that time, students should return to their homes or to another prearranged place of shelter.



TECHNOLOGY

Students who choose to bring devices to school are reminded to keep them in a safe place or to give them to their classroom teachers to safeguard them from harm. The school is not responsible for lost or damaged items. It is expected that students comply with the guidelines set out for them by the school. **Cell phones are not to be used at school or on the bus and photos of students are not to be taken or posted from any school activity.**



EMERGENCY DRILLS Students participate in regular fire evacuation and emergency drills throughout the school year to practice student safety procedures. We start our practices in September. Please reassure your children these drills are for safety's sake. Please take note of the orange newsletter sent home that informs parents of the language and protocols now used in the SD57 regarding emergency procedures.

- **Hold & Secure** – used if there is a security concern in the neighborhood
- **Shelter in Place** – used if there is an environmental hazard (or wildlife) concern in the vicinity of the school
- **Lockdown** – Used in response to dangerous assailant within the school
- **Evacuation** – used if fires, earthquakes, hazardous spills or as required



Our newsletter is available the middle of each month. It is delivered by email, posted on the website, or available for pick up at the office. **Starting each October, we will not distribute hard copies to students.** Our newsletters serve as one of the main forms of communication between parents and the school. It is very important that parents make a note of changes in schedules, school closures, and other special dates. We also send reminders through the REMIND text app. Please ensure your cell phone number and email address are current at the office so you can receive this important information.

9. Bus driver is authorized to assign seats

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BUS RULES



NEW: Bus registration is now online and must be completed every year by the end of the school year or service may be interrupted in the fall. Courtesy bus registration occurs in August.

The new busing company is First Student Canada. Online registration can be accessed on the district website www.sd57.bc.ca and questions regarding busing can be emailed to busregistration@sd57.bc.ca

Please remember that school rules apply to the bus as well. Inappropriate behavior may result in conduct notices or suspensions. The drivers need to ensure they are attending to road and traffic conditions and cannot be dealing with misbehavior and other safety issues.
