Writing performance for all grades with the exception of grade 5(45%) have 80% or greater meeting/fully meeting or extending. Both our indigenous and non-indigenous students scored within these targets	Our grade 5's are weak and have a significant number of LD students who have struggles since K.	-A focus for support next year at the grade 6 level needs to occur -Continue the school wide use of Seravelo writing and interactive read aloud kits to support writing.
Reading performance for all grades with the exception of grade 5(34%) have 60% or more reading at or beyond grade level. Both our indigenous and non-indigenous students are comparable in performance	Our grade 5's are weak and have a significant number of LD students who have struggles since K. While we have made good progress with the LLI and interactive read aloud kits continued work is needed	A focus for support next year at the grade 6 level needs to occur. Continued LLI intervention, participation in rural schools and continue the focus of the interactive read aloud at all grade levels
Numeracy performance for intermediate grades showed 75% + scored a 2 or 3 which indicates understanding of the number concepts. Primary students scored lower at 52%	Data indicates that while our students do show significant improvement by the intermediate grades, concentrated effort on these skills at the primary level are required and this may also lead to better intermediate scores in later years	Number sense targeted focus and support at the primary level is required -participate in the math up program and Marion small PD and materials
