### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

- 214 students
- New councillor starts soon
  - One day per week (Fridays)
- Health and Safety
  - o First fire drill has occurred
  - o Remainder of emergency procedures to be completed in near future
  - o If children are not riding the bus, caregivers must inform the school/bus driver
- Recent vandalism at the school
- Bussing
  - o DP Todd / Duchess bussing has been a challenge
  - o Expecting finalized routes next week
- Dates
  - o Terry Fox Run is set for this Friday
- PAC meetings can now be held in the school
  - o Hybrid model can be provided (in person / Zoom)
- Hot lunches can resume if following COVID-19 protocols from district
- Several paper orders for school swag are in the school mailbox
- Leadership has started
- Path for resolving issues: approach classroom teacher first, then principal Laurie Bryce if not resolved via teacher

### TREASURER'S REPORT

- FY starts July 1
- Primary goal is to support families as best we can during this pandemic
  - o Minimize out-of-pocket expenses
- General account

- Proposing to support scholarships and bursaries from general rather than gaming account
- o As of September 30: \$16,288.92
- Gaming account
  - o As of September 30: \$6915.14
- Budget info is available on the Edgewood Elementary school website
- Spirit wear seems profitable thus far
- Budget proposal: General
  - $\circ$  Est. profit of  $\sim$ \$4500 5K
  - Anticipating lower profits from fundraising
  - Maintaining traditional expenses
    - Committed \$150 for classroom teachers
    - Committed \$1K to grads
    - Committed to yearbook expenses
    - Committed to sponsor planners for students this year
  - o Budgeting for bursaries from general for 20/21
  - Anticipating ~\$8K in expenditures this year
- Budget proposal: Gaming
  - o Minimized expenditures by half this year
  - Committed to funding cultural events, cross-country skiing for grades 4/5, and downhill skiing for grades 6/7
  - Yearbook subsidy to be provided
  - ~\$3500 in expenses
- Sarah motioned to pass the 20/21budget as proposed; seconded by Marian

## STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

- Popcorn day possibility TBD
  - ACTION: Laurie Bryce to look into possibility of popcorn days (packaging options)
- Hot lunch
  - o Tracy Becker volunteered for hot lunch again this year
  - Lunches must be pre-packaged and labelled
  - o Pizza hot lunches are a possibility
- Veggie program will continue following COVID-19 protocols
- Munch a Lunch program has the ability to create labels if needed
- Yearbook
  - Laura volunteered
