To Glenview Families,

We hope everyone is doing well! I wanted to share some of the plans we are putting into place next week.

These plans have come into play as we once again navigate through changes in our protocols as outlined by our Provincial Health Officer, Minister of Education, and our Board Office. We will be doing everything possible to ensure our school can remain open, students learning, and everyone safe and healthy.

How you can help:

- *Ensure your child completes a Health Check every day
- *Keep your child home if they are feeling sick
- *Follow recommendations of the Provincial Health Officer
- *Drop off your child close to morning bell (8:40am)
- *Pick up close to dismissal bell (2:42pm)
- *Contact the school if your child is away
- *Visitors are limited to those who support activities that are of direct benefit to student learning and well-being

How we can help:

- *Students go to specific zones prior to lining up at 8:40am
- *Teachers will let students in one division at a time
- *Reduce congestion in common areas
- *Reinforce mask wearing
- *Reinforce hand hygiene
- *Only half the students outside during a recess break (there will be 2 recesses)
- *Half the students eating inside while other half is outside (switch half-way through lunch)
- *Divisions 1-5 - recess (10:00-10:15), eat lunch 12:15-12:38, play outside 12:40-1:00
- *Divisions 6-10 - recess (10:15-10:30), play outside 12:15-12:38, eat lunch 12:40-1:00
- *Reduce visitors to building except for educational purposes

In the event we are short staffed, we have a plan in place to ensure students can still attend. This may include combining classes.

In the event that our school has to close, teachers have developed plans on how to share student work/activities.

As of Monday, January 10, we are open to all our students. Homework packages are not being provided as we are not looking at transitional learning at this time. If your child is away, please continue to build skills by reading to and with them, daily writing, math activities at their level (counting, sorting, estimating, calculating etc.). Our school website has many learning activities that students have access to. If you are wanting passwords for specific learning sites, please contact the classroom teacher.

In the meantime, we are looking forward to having the students back, and moving forward with in-person learning.
