Number of Awards: 3

Amount of Each Award: \$1,000.00

Eligibility: Must be a self-identified aboriginal student.

Criteria: Demonstrated satisfactory academic achievement and financial need

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

Criteria: Demonstrate satisfactory academic achievement and financial need

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

Special Conditions: A letter of reference or certificate outlining active involvement in a school Science Fair.

BUCKHORN ELEMENTARY P.A.C. BURSARY

This award is given to a graduating student who attended Buckhorn Elementary School, who intends to pursue a post-secondary education at any recognized educational institution (including Trade School).

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$500.00

Eligibility: Open to students who completed Grade 7 at Buckhorn Elementary and attended Buckhorn Elementary for at least 3 consecutive years including Grade 7.

Criteria: Demonstrated satisfactory academic achievement and is in financial need. Demonstrated volunteer work, participated within the community and/or school events; show leadership qualities with a willingness to help others. Applicants must indicate current career goals.

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

Special Conditions: A letter of reference outlining volunteer work, community/school participation, leadership etc. must accompany application.

This Award is paid directly by the donor, once the recipient has begun Full Time Post Secondary.

CENTRAL BUILDERS' HOME BUILDING CENTRE BURSARY

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$250.00

Eligibility: Open to students who attend school in the City of Prince George.

Criteria: Demonstrated satisfactory academic achievement and financial need.

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

CORPORAL DARREN JAMES FITZPATRICK MEMORIAL BURSARY

Corporal Darren James Fitzpatrick was born in Burnaby, raised in Prince George and graduated from Kelly Road Secondary. Darren was the 141st military casualty of Canada's mission in Afghanistan. He will forever be remembered as the proud Canadian and courageous leader he was. This award was established as a tribute to the brave service of our military troops in the defense of our country. This award is available to a student from School District 57 pursuing a career in the Canadian Forces as preference. If there are no students entering the Canadian Forces this award will be available to a student pursuing a career in the RCMP or as a Fire Fighter.

Number of Awards: 2

Amount of Each Award: \$1,000.00

Eligibility: Preference will be given to a student from Kelly Road Secondary meeting the criteria. If there are no students from KRSS then the award is available to any student within School District No. 57 meeting the criteria.

Criteria: Demonstrated satisfactory academic achievement and financial need.

Selection Process: Selected by the Donor

Special Conditions: Award will be given upon confirmation of acceptance from the Canadian Forces, RCMP or upon proof of full time enrollment related to becoming a Fire Fighter.

CUPE LOCAL 3742, MEMBERSHIP BENEFIT APPRENTICESHIP/CAREER AND TECHNICAL TRAINING PROGRAM CLOSED BURSARY

Members of CUPE 3742 are support workers for School District No. 57.

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$600.00

Eligibility: Open to students enrolled in a Secondary School Apprenticeship Program or a Career and Technical Training Program, who are the son, daughter or dependent of a member in good standing of CUPE Local 3742.

Criteria: Demonstrated satisfactory academic achievement, financial need, and ability to achieve educational goals.

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

Special Conditions: A recipient from the Apprenticeship Program must continue the apprenticeship beyond secondary school with an approved apprenticeship training program.

A recipient from the Career and Technical Training Program must enroll in an academic, vocational or apprenticeship program in an approved post-secondary education institution.

One student cannot win more than one CUPE 3742 award.

CUPE LOCAL 3742, MEMBERSHIP BENEFIT CLOSED BURSARY

Members of CUPE 3742 are support workers for School District No. 57.

Number of Awards: 2

Amount of Each Award: \$500.00

Selection Process: Selected by the District Awards Committee. One student cannot win more than one CUPE 3742 award.

ECOLE LAC DES BOIS PAC BURSARY

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$250.00

Eligibility: Open to students who have attended Ecole Lac des Bois School for a minimum of four years.

Criteria: Demonstrated satisfactory academic achievement, good citizenship and financial need.

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee. This award must be claimed within 2 years following grade 12 graduation.

EDGEWOOD ELEMENTARY SCHOOL BURSARY

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$400.00

Eligibility: Open to students who have attended Edgewood Elementary School for a minimum of two years.

Criteria: Demonstrated satisfactory academic achievement and financial need.

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee. Award is paid directly by donor

FREDA ERRICSON MEMORIAL NURSING BURSARY

This award was established in 2001 by family, and friends to honour the memory of Freda Erricson. Freda was a dedicated Licensed Practical Nurse and Nursing Unit Clerk at the Prince George Regional Hospital for over 35 years. Her conscientious and compassionate nature endeared her to the many patients, co-workers, friends and family. It is hoped that this bursary will be awarded to someone who is determined to put kindness back into the nursing profession.

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$150.00 for 2020-2021

Eligibility: Open to students who intend to pursue a career in the field of nursing.

Criteria: Demonstrated satisfactory academic achievement and financial need. Demonstrated good character and citizenship.

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

Special Conditions: A letter indicating reasons for pursuing a nursing career must accompany the application. A letter of reference outlining good character and involvement in school and community volunteer activities, must accompany application.

GIRL GUIDES OF CANADA – PRINCE GEORGE DISTRICTS BURSARY

This award, which promotes the Vision, Mission and Principles of the Girl Guides of Canada as expressed in Policy, Organization and Rules, will be granted to a female student who has resided in Prince George for a minimum of three years, and is an active youth Member of Girl Guides of Canada in a Prince George District.

Number of Awards: 2

Amount of Each Award: \$400.00

Eligibility: Open to female students who are active youth Members of Girl Guides of Canada in a Prince George District for a minimum of the last three years.

Criteria: Demonstrated satisfactory academic achievement and financial need and commitment to self-improvement.

Selection Process: Selected by Donor

Special Condition: The recipient is to continue her involvement in Guiding in whatever way possible, submitting a letter of progress to the Girl Guides of Canada – Prince George District’s Bursary Committee at the end of the year. Two letters of reference (one from a Guider) outlining commitment to self-improvement and current involvement in Girl Guides of Canada within a Prince George District must accompany application. The recipient must agree to have her name and photograph publicized.

GISCOME SCHOOL PARENT ADVISORY COUNCIL BURSARY

Selection Process: Selected by the donor

Special Condition: A letter of reference outlining leadership & community involvement must accompany application.

GLENVIEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOL BURSARY

Number of Awards: 2

Amount of Each Award: \$250.00

Eligibility: Open to students who attended Glenview Elementary School, Salmon Valley Elementary (closed 2009/10) and/or Shady Valley Elementary (closed 2009/10) for two or more years.

Criteria: Demonstrated satisfactory academic achievement and financial need. Demonstrated involvement in school, community or volunteer activities.

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

Special Conditions: A letter of reference outlining community and/or school involvement must accompany the application.

HAROLD MOFFAT MEMORIAL BURSARY

This award is being distributed in memory of Harold Moffat. Harold actively pursued the development of post-secondary education in Prince George.

This award is given to graduating students who intend to pursue a post-secondary education in the trades at CNC.

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$550 for 2020-21

Eligibility: Open to all students who attend school in School District No. 57.

Criteria: Demonstrate satisfactory academic achievement and financial need.

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee

Special Conditions: A letter of reference that testifies to the applicant's character including traits of honesty, integrity, punctuality and a commitment to hard work must accompany this application.

HART HIGHLANDS PAC BURSARY

Number of Awards: 1

Amount of Each Award: \$500.00

Eligibility: Open to students who have attended Hart Highlands Elementary School for a minimum of 2 years.

Criteria: Demonstrated satisfactory level of academic achievement and financial need. Demonstrated involvement in extra-curricular activities.

Selection Process: Selected by District Awards Committee
