

Dual Credit Courses

Are you in Grade 11?

Students need to apply for Dual Credit near the end of their Grade 11 year, so that they can be admitted and choose their UNBC courses alongside their Grade 12 course selections, which take place in April of their Grade 11 year. Jump-start your university career with Dual Credit Courses at UNBC in your Grade 12 year.

What is Dual Credit?

University courses that current high school students can use towards post-secondary credits as well as high school graduation. Students are able to take up to three courses in their senior year (September – December, January – April, and May – June).

What are the Costs?

- Courses must be approved by the school district as “Dual Credit” to receive provincial funding which covers tuition costs.
- Student fees are covered by UNBC.
- Additional course fees must be covered by the student e.g. text books, lab supplies, field trip costs.

Student Responsibilities

- Be a high school student as defined by the Ministry of Education.
- Receive permission and support from their local school district to take Dual Credit courses and receive credit for Grade 12 graduation.
- Meet all pre-requisites for the UNBC course.
- Attend all UNBC classes.

Past UNBC Dual-Credit courses:

- Arts 102: Research Writing
- Chemistry 100: General Chemistry I
- Commerce 100: Intro to Canadian Business
- First Nations Studies 100: The Aboriginal Peoples of Canada
- University 101: Intro to Higher Education

Students must be nominated by a school counsellor to be considered for the Dual Credit program.
