PRINCIPALS MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Fall is just about over and winter will soon be upon us. I appreciate that Glenview students love playing outside and getting fresh air. This is the first school I've been at in a while where the students haven't asked why they have to go outside. Please continue to send them dressed for the weather, because even at -20 if there is no wind, students can enjoy playing outside for at least part of lunch hour. All of us do better with fresh air and nature around us.

Our students have completed fall assessments in literacy and in math and we are tailoring our support based on the assessment results. Many people at Glenview are available to support children emotionally and academically. All support begins with the classroom teacher. For those needing additional support, our Counsellor, Mrs. Schmeisser and our Aboriginal Education Worker, Mrs. Dexter, work hard to help students feel listened to, and to provide them with friendship skills and tools to calm themselves and stay focused on learning. Our two Resource Teachers, Mrs. Seemann and Mrs. Jones, have been busy devising support plans for our students who require Education Assistant support or Learning Assistance. Our English Language and Learning Assistance Teachers, Mrs. Braraten and Mrs. Jones have been working with small groups to build vocabulary and improve oral and written language skills. We are fortunate to have so many people who care about students and who dedicate themselves to making sure everyone reaches their potential.

You should have received an interim report on your child's progress, particularly with regards to work habits and work completion. In December, you will receive a written communication of student learning that will focus on the academic progress your child is making.

In between all the hard work, we are making sure that Glenview is also a fun place to be—ROCKS draws, our Turkey Trot draw, our Halloween costume parade, volleyball games, daily announcements read by student announcers, Leadership, and Choir are all opportunities for students to have some fun doing something they enjoy. Watch for Lego Club starting soon at recess once a week, and other opportunities for students to use their many talents and skills. We want Glenview to be the best school that it can be, and with your help, we can make that happen!

A BUS SAFETY MESSAGE

These frosty mornings remind us that snowy weather isn't far off, and so we want to take this time to send winter weather reminders for bus families. Although schools remain open during winter weather events, bus service may occasionally have to be cancelled for the day if road conditions are considered too dangerous due to snow or icy conditions. Announcements regarding bus delays or cancellations are made via local radio stations on the affected day. Please ensure children are dressed for the weather; frostbite of exposed skin can occur in a very short time. Students are not expected to wait for a bus more than 15 minutes past the scheduled pick-up time. If the bus has not arrived by that time, they should return home or to a prearranged place of shelter. The decision to keep a student home for the day due to winter weather conditions shall be made by a parent/guardian.
