Principal's Message

Happy Spring!

I hope that you and your family enjoyed a safe and healthy Spring Break and Easter holiday and were able to get outside to enjoy the changing season.

Coming back from the holidays we will be following additional protocols set by the Ministry of Education and the Provincial Health Officer which include:

- Masks must be worn inside our schools and buildings by all students in Grades 4-12
- Masks may be removed inside only when students are eating or drinking
- Masks must be worn on school buses by all students in Grades 4-12
- Masks must be worn by all adults in schools or school district buildings (staff, visitors etc.)
- Masks may be removed inside only when eating or drinking
- Masks are encouraged but not required for students in Grades K-3- this remains a personal choice.

The School building remains locked. Please knock on the office windows to access the school staff or call the school.

Daily Health check-ins at home

We are asking families to please do their best to arrive on time. As we have to keep the doors locked, it can be difficult to let students in through the morning. If you are bringing your child late, please call the school when you get here and patiently wait until someone is able to let your child in as we are often busy.

Courtesy Bussing limitations – They are only allowed for daycare or afterschool care purposes. Contact the office if you have any questions.

Electronic Sprayers



Please note that our custodians use the electrostatic sprayers to sanitize rooms at all SD57 schools. The custodial staff enter rooms as soon as students go outside for lunch break, and sanitize. It then takes 10 minutes for the cleaning solution to dry. This cleaner has been approved by all stakeholder groups. Just one more safety measure that is new to us!

Under the School District 57's Administrative Procedures and Guidelines animals in our school or on our property are not permitted without the pre-approved permission of the school Principal or designate and only for educational purposes. This approval does not supersede the regulations set under the Regional District Bylaws. We appreciate your cooperation as we work together to support safe spaces at school.
