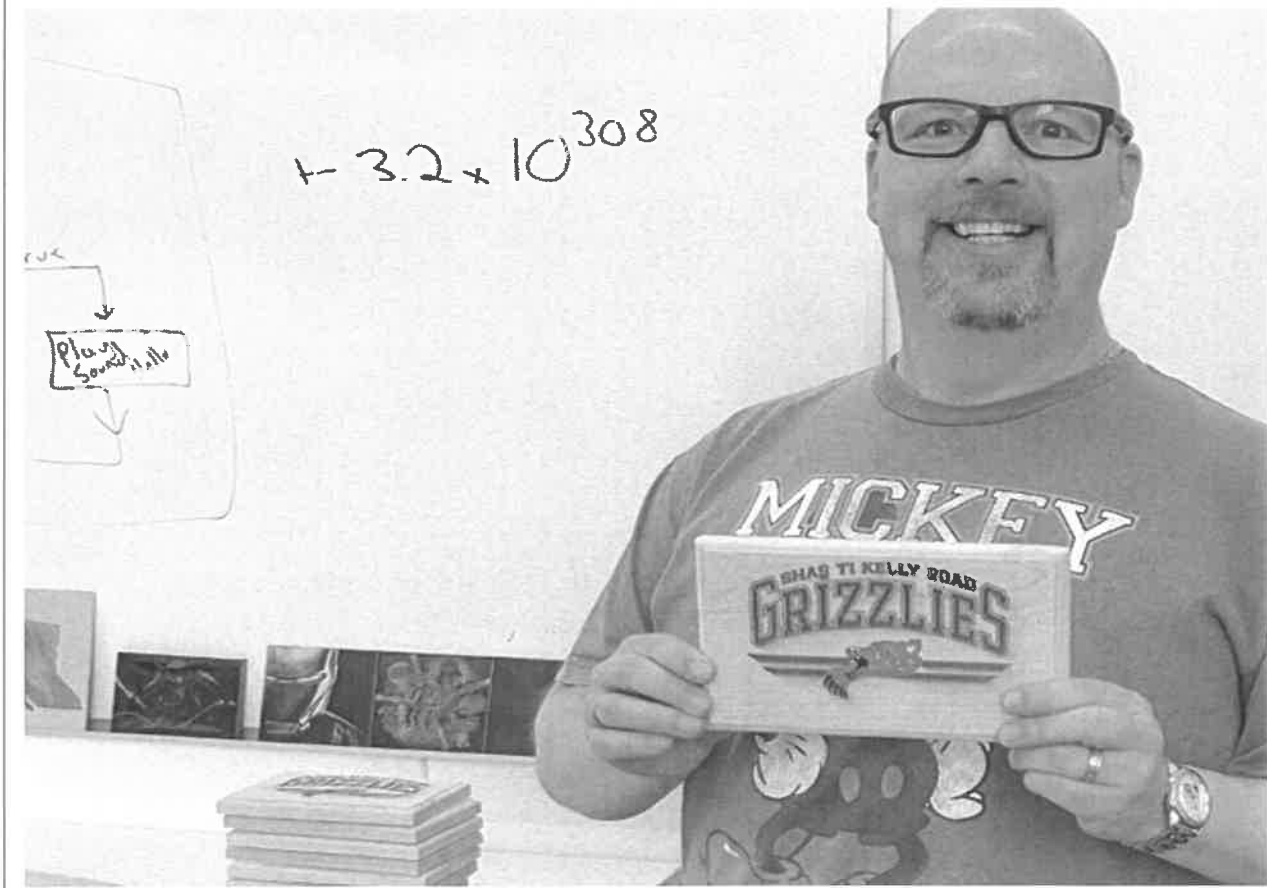

Re: 2022 – 2023 Online Bus Registration

This is a reminder that effective for the 2022 – 2023 school year parent/guardian(s) of children that qualify for regular bussing to and from the child's home residence and their catchment area school who wish to register for bussing MUST complete an online bus registration form annually for each of their children. Students qualify for bussing in accordance with Policy 3541 Student Transportation – Home and School.

The annual online regular bus registration is now open. To register, please visit the school district website at www.sd57.bc.ca

Parent/guardian(s) that do not have access to the internet may contact their child's school for assistance.

Applications received after June 28th will be accommodated based on available seating. Please note bussing will not be available to late registrants until October 1st.

An online "courtesy" bus registration process will begin in late August and students will be accommodated in accordance with Policy 3541. Bussing for approved courtesy riders for the 2022 – 2023 school year will commence mid October.
